Armando Barrientos is Professor and Research Director at the Brooks World Poverty Institute at the University of Manchester. He gained his BA and PhD from the University of Kent at Canterbury in the UK. He is a Senior Researcher with the Chronic Poverty Research Centre, leading research on Insecurity, Risk, and Vulnerability. His research interests focus on the linkages existing between welfare programmes and labour markets in developing countries, and on policies addressing poverty, vulnerability, and population ageing. His work has been published widely, including articles in *World Development, Applied Economics, The Manchester School* and *Geneva Papers on Risk and Insurance*. He has acted as an adviser to the ILO, the World Bank, DFID, UNRISD, IADB, WIEGO, UN-DESA, UNICEF, and the Caribbean Development Bank.
